



State Geography and Demographics Overview











Size

Maryland – **12,407** sq miles (94% in Bay watershed)

Pennsylvania – **46,054** sq miles (50% in Bay watershed)

Virginia – **42,775** sq miles (54% in Bay watershed)











Maryland 6.043 mil people

Pennsylvania 12.81 mil people


Virginia 8.518 mil people







Virginia: 40 (Senate) 100 (House)




Maryland Districts

Each of the 47 Districts has: 1 Senator & 3 Delegates


Total of: **47** Senators **141** Delegates

Each Senator represents approximately: **123,000** people

Each Delegate represents approximately: **40,947 – 123,000** people

Pennsylvania Districts


50 Senate Districts

Total of: **50** Senators


203 Representatives



Legislative Process Overview









Bill is introduced/ sponsored

Bill goes to Committee Bill goes to the full chamber for debate and vote

Bill goes to the other chamber for Committee process, debate and vote

Bill goes to Governor for signing



Length of Session

Maryland: 90 days

Virginia: 60 days (in even numbered years)

30 (45) days (in odd numbered years)

Pennsylvania: 2 years



Bill is Introduced

Maryland: ~3,000 bills are introduced per session (Of the 3,127 bills introduced in 2018, 890 passed, or **28%**)

Bill is introduced/ sponsored

Pennsylvania: ~4,000 bills are introduced per session (Of the 4,021 bills introduced in 2017-18, 246 were enacted, or **6%**)

Virginia: ~3,000 bills are introduced per session (Of the 2,778 bills introduced in 2018, 919 passed, or **33%**)



Budget Process










Budget Cycle





Length of Cycle

Maryland Pennsylvania



Annual

Virginia



Biennial



Process (in a nutshell)

Issuance of Budget Instructions

Agencies review and submit requests to Governor

Governor prepares budget

Governor presents budget to General Assembly

Budget goes through legislative process in the General Assembly

Budget goes back to the governor*


*But NOT in Maryland





The Budget Cycle

Budget is enacted upon adoption of the conference committee report. The Governor does not sign the bill and may not line item veto any part of the bill



Governor and DBM hold budget hearings to review agency requests

DBM: Department of Budget and Management

GA: General Assembly



Things to Note: Maryland


- Relative power of Governor v. Legislature
- No veto or amending authority by the governor
- Capital Budget Bond Bill

Things to Note: Pennsylvania

- Water quality spending is statewide, not Bay Watershed specific
- Two budgets per session




- ► Short Session
- ► Governor is limited to 4-year term
